

Kaman Fuzing Receives Boeing Order for SLAM-ER Arming Fuzes

MIDDLETOWN, Conn. – Kaman Corp.'s Kaman Precision Products Fuzing division located in Middletown, Connecticut, has received an award from The Boeing Company for the Standoff Land-Attack Missile – Expanded Response (SLAM-ER) program, Kaman said in a release.
